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Introduction

This policy has been reviewed and amended by paying consideration to Welsh Government Statutory guidance for school governing bodies on school uniform and appearance policies Education, Wales (Published December 2022 updated May 2023).

This states that uniforms should:

- provide a sense of identity, community and cohesion within the school
- support positive behaviour and school discipline
- ensure students dress appropriately for learning activity
- remove peer pressure to dress in particular fashions
- enable students of all backgrounds to share in a common identity which embraces their particular requirements
- help reduce inequalities between students and help reduce some triggers for bullying
- benefit safeguarding and attendance policies through helping to identify truants
- assist identification of strangers on school premises
- support and promote the ethos of the school

In particular, this policy must:

- ensure that due regard is given to securing equality of treatment between students of different sexes and genders, students from different ethnic and religious backgrounds, and disabled students
- minimise cost and assure as far as is reasonable, that uniforms are affordable by all
- consider practical considerations involved in introducing or changing school uniform and appearance policies
- consult with parents, students and the community whenever significant uniform changes are proposed

Other considerations

School uniform policies should not dictate different items of clothing on the basis of sex/gender and have should have a sensible, flexible approach to uniform items to account for extreme weather conditions.

The guidance also sets out the current position in Wales regarding financial assistance for parents towards the cost of purchasing school uniforms of which CCS adheres to. For full details, please see the statutory guidance document (see link below).

Ysgol Treffynnon is committed to keeping the cost of uniforms to an absolute minimum to ensure affordability for all. To achieve this the school has removed the need for logos on all items except for the badge on the school blazer, which can be bought separately and sewn on. All uniform items are readily available from local supermarkets and other outlets apart from the school tie, which can be purchased from school or from the retailers noted at the end of the policy.

School Uniform

Uniform

Top clothing

- Coat or waterproof jacket (for wet weather)
- Black Blazer with School Badge sew on badges can be purchased separately (compulsory)
- Grey V-neck jumper (optional)
- Plain white shirt/blouse with collar
- School Tie (compulsory)

Bottom Clothing

- Plain black trousers/knee length skirt
- Plain black dress shorts
- Plain black socks

Footwear

Plain black footwear (leather is advisable for wet weather)

PE Kit

Top Clothing

- Plain black polo shirt
- Reversible red/black rugby shirt (for those doing rugby)
- Plain black cold and wet weather tracksuit top/fleece/hoodie

Bottom Clothing

- Plain black shorts/skort/tracksuit bottoms/leggings
- Plain red sports socks





Footwear

- Trainers suitable for sports hall
- Sports boots (for wet weather outdoor grass pitches and for use on the AstroTurf)

All personal property should be clearly labelled.

The school is **not** responsible for lost or stolen items (including electrical items such as mobile phones).

Unacceptable Clothing

- Jumpers other than school approved
- Hoodies other than school approved
- Polo shirts other than for PE
- Jeggings
- Leggings (other than for PE lessons)
- Skinny jeans or denim
- Micro/mini skirts
- Highly coloured footwear/trainers (except for PE)

Anyone arriving at school in non-uniform clothing will be offered available items from school stock or sent home to change.

Equality and Diversity

Our uniform is non-gender specific. The school is respectful of all faiths and where specific faiths require alterations to uniform and appearance code, we will do our best to accommodate those needs. Students with a disability, who may need amendments to the uniform, will be accommodated. Parents are advised to contact the Headteacher.

Appearance

Ysgol Treffynnon wants to ensure all students are prepared for the workplace. All working environments have clothing and appearance expectations appropriate for work.





Hair

Hair must be of natural colours only. It is not permissible to have any part of the hair in unnatural colours or shades of unnatural colours e.g. pink, blue, green, yellow etc. No tram lines, including insignia and patterns, are permitted in any hair length.

In practical areas, hair which is shoulder length or longer must be tied back.

Make-Up

Make-up can be worn; however, it must be natural and suitable for a professional workplace. No false eye lashes, lipstick or excessive make-up is permitted

Jewellery

One wrist watch is acceptable. Students with pierced ears can wear small earrings that do not extend beyond the earlobe to ensure health and safety of all. One small discreet nose stud will be accepted.

No other jewellery is allowed. This includes any form of facial or body piercing (excluding nose stud as per the paragraph above). Parents and students are requested to respect the rules on jewellery and to have any new piercings at the beginning of the summer holiday to enable jewellery to be removed easily.

Nails

The school permits nail varnish to be worn, however, it should be of a discreet colour. Nails must be of a safe, practical length so as not to cause injury to self or others.

No false nails or extensions are permissible as this breaches health and safety and will result in students being sent home to have their nails cut.

Uniform Suppliers

The uniform has been developed to ensure it is easy and cheap to buy from a range of local retailers and supermarkets. However, the school does have two specific uniform outlets where uniform can be bought.

Uniform Recycling Scheme / Second Hand Uniform

To help all our students meet our high standards, Ysgol Treffynnon operates a school uniform recycling scheme. We welcome any donations of clean, good condition uniform.
